

What did we discover?

- 1. +\$67k of revenue incorrectly booked to FY22, now correctly booked to FY23, but it did have corresponding expenses
 - a. -\$26k of write-offs from expenditures we will not be reimbursed for
- 2. -\$182k of deferred revenue adjusted back into FY22
- 3. -\$111k of revenues adjusted back into FY22, based on expenses incurred
- 4. Previously discussed deficit drivers in FY23:
 - a. underbudgeted custodial, legal, contractors (ASL and finance), and payroll expenses

Bottom line:

- 1. The auditors will recommend a restatement of the FY22 financials, which we will present and approve in the course of the FY23 audit (expected in January)
- 2. FY22 will not end in with a deficit, which is important
- 3. FY23 will end with a deficit of ~\$430k, or 9%
- 4. FY24 (this current year) is, at this time, still projected to break even
- 5. FY25 is looking even better, given this current year's excellent enrollment drive

Panoramic Survey Action Items

Goal #1 - STUDENTS

53% of our students indicate feeling a positive energy of the school. It is our goal to move our students into a positive feeling of energy at the school to 75%, an increase of 25% above the 60% established in the national dataset of high schools in the United States.

Goal #2 - PARENTS

Increase parent belief in grit (how well students are able to persevere through setbacks to achieve important long-term goals) from <u>48% to 65% over the next year</u>. As a result, we will see a decrease in chronic absenteeism, an increase in higher level community engagement (such as internships that require resilience and tenacity problem solving of real-time challenges.)

Goal #3 - FACULTY

Our goal is to increase the perception of the amount and quality of feedback that faculty and staff receive from 28% to 55%.

For Baxter to succeed, we must provide:

- high quality education,
- model for innovative problem solving,
- fiscal restraint,
- community engagement and integration,
- and relevance to the economy.
